



J. Roger Glunt

- J. Roger Glunt is a 1960 graduate of the University of Pittsburgh School of Business and was a member of the University of Pittsburgh Board of Trustees from 1997-2005. In 2008, the University elected Glunt an Emeritus Trustee. He was the 1994-95 and the 1995-96 President of the University of Pittsburgh Alumni Association and in 2005 elected Director Emeritus. In 2000, Glunt was named Volunteer of the Year by the Pitt Alumni Association and in 2003 the Alumnus of Distinction by the Pitt Band. Glunt received the Nursing Honorary alumni award in 2002 and the Trustee Medallion in 2005. In 2006, the University presented Glunt the Distinguished Alumni Fellow Award. In 2009, J. Roger Glunt was named the recipient of the Bill Baierl Distinguished Alumni Service Award by the Pitt Alumni Association. Glunt was chair of the Chancellor's Circle from 2010 to 2014.
- During his undergraduate time at Pitt, Glunt was a member of the Varsity Marching Band and was one of the original herald trumpeters. He served as a two term president of the Sigma Chi fraternity, was a member of the band fraternity, Kappa Kappa Psi, and was the student commander of the Army ROTC band. In recent years, Glunt established the Nancy Glunt Hoffman Memorial fund in the Pitt School of Nursing which has endowed a chair in oncology nursing and to honor his late sister Nancy, NUR 63 BSN and the Robert L. Arthur Memorial Fund to support the student musicians of the Pitt Band and to honor his undergraduate band director at Pitt.
- J. Roger Glunt is a homebuilder, remodeler, real estate developer, and housing advocate from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Glunt is the President of Glunt Development Co., Inc.
- Glunt has long been active in local, state, and national housing issues. He was the 1969 President of the Builders Association of Metropolitan Pittsburgh, the 1976 President of the Pennsylvania Builders Association, and the 1993 President of the National Association of Home Builders. Glunt served as a member of the Board of the Federal Home Loan Bank of Pittsburgh from 1995 through 2001 and was Chairman of its Affordable Housing & Community Investment Committee during that period. Glunt has served as the 1998, 2001, and 2002 Chairman of the Board of the NAHB Research Center, and the Chairman of the Board of the National Housing Endowment from 1995 to 2003. Glunt served as a member of the Fannie Mae National Advisory Council in 1994 and 1995.
- Glunt was inducted into the National Housing Hall of Fame in 1991.
- In 1973, served as a member of the Governor's Commission on Mortgage Interest Rates in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Glunt was a member of the Board of the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency and Chairman of its Project Review Committee from 1985 to 1996.
- Glunt was a member of the Churchill Borough Council for ten years (1983-92). For eight years, he served as Vice President of Council and as Chairman of the Police Committee.
- In 1988 and 1989, Glunt was President of the Westinghouse Valley Chamber of Commerce.
- Glunt was an artillery officer in the U.S. Army from 1960 to 1962 and completed his active duty at the rank of 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant.
- Glunt is a member of the Pennsylvania State University Advisory Committee for the Bernard and Henrietta Hankin Chair of Residential Construction and also a member of the Pennsylvania State

University Advisory Committee for the J. Roger Glunt Graduate Fellowship in Residential Construction.

- In 1994, Glunt was presented the “Significant Sig” award by the Sigma Chi fraternity and in 1998 Sigma Chi inducted Glunt into the Order of Constantine. In 2007, Glunt was elected to the Sigma Chi Hall of Fame.
- Glunt received a Hearthstone BUILDER Lifetime Public Service Award in 2004 and was the recipient of the CASE District II Robert L. Payton Award for Voluntary Service in 2004.
- In 2012, Glunt was inducted into the Lou Holtz/Upper Ohio Valley Hall of Fame, receiving the Distinguished American Award.
- In 2013, Glunt received the John Heinz Friend of Nursing Award from the Pennsylvania State Nurses Association.
- Glunt presently serves as the President of the Homebuilding Community Foundation.
- Glunt and his wife, Lee has five children and eleven grandchildren. They reside in suburban Pittsburgh in the Borough of Churchill.
